The Kenosha County Sheriff's Department, in cooperation with the Sex Offender Notification Committee, is releasing the following information pursuant to Wisconsin State Statue 301.46(2m). This statute <u>now</u> allows law enforcement agencies to inform the public of a sex offender's release when; in the discretion of this committee, the release of the information will enhance public safety, awareness and protection.

The individual who appears on this notification has been convicted of a sex offense. Further, his criminal history places him in a classification level which reflects the *potential* to re-offend.

<u>This offender is NOT wanted by the Sheriff's Department at this time.</u> This notification is not intended to alarm the community; but rather it is our belief that an informed community is a safer community.

Sex offenders have always lived in our communities after release from incarceration. With the enactment of Statue 301.46(2m) in 1997, law enforcement is now allowed to share this information with the community. Abuse of this information to threaten, intimidate, or harass a registered sex offender will not be tolerated. Mr. Butterbrodt performed sexual acts upon a seven year old male acquaintance and also had the child perform sexual acts on him. He also showed a pornographic movie to the child.

Mr. Butterbrodt is being placed into the community on November 12, 2009 after having been released from prison in November 2009. He will be residing within a half mile radius of CTH W and CTH FR and is on the short range electronic monitoring system. He is not employed at this time.

He is to have no unsupervised contact with minors, no taverns, bars or liquor stores. He is to have no contact with his victim and is not to consume alcohol or drugs. He must comply with standard sex offender rules, face to face contact with law enforcement is required, and must comply with all requirements and lifetime registrant of Wisconsin Sex Offender Registration Program.
