This March we hired our new Superintendent of Schools and started the process of mapping a vision for our future, Wilmot staff are meeting to create a new mission statement. Last fall the Board of Education formed The Academic Affairs Committee by public invitation to

district stakeholders. The primary purpose of the committee is to be a resource to the Board and Administration in regards to academics at Wilmot. Their first task: facilitate the creation of the guiding vision for the district for the next five years!

The committee is composed of seven community members, two district staff, and one board member. They have been meeting monthly since the fall of 2010 to help develop the process that all district stakeholders can participate in to create the vision. Their chief request: guide WIImot to greatness! "They are the most dedicated group of volunteers I have worked with in a long while," says Brenda Turner, Wilmot's Director of Curriculum and Instruction, "They sincerely want this to be a collaborative process with everyone that has a stake in the success of the high school: students, staff, taxpayers, parents, business owners and feeder school communities. They are working as hard as they can so that it will be just that!"

The vision process is about to launch and the committee is looking for district stakeholders to participate in two events: a District Assessment Survey, and a Vision Workshop taking place over two evenings. The survey is short, easy to do, and can be taken online or print. It will give the committee and Vision Workshop participants an honest assessment of the current perceptions of the district. The Vision Workshop, held on May 24 and June 1, from 6-8 p.m. each evening, will be used to define what Wilmot will look like in five years through the process of creating Vision Statements in five key areas.
